Opportunities for VCS

Threefold:

- For thematic groups who support target groups e.g health, disability BME
- For thematic groups who provide services to target groups as well as support
- For groups who provide broad range of work related support as core activity

Strengths/Offer of VCS



- Reach/Engagement VCS groups in touch with people furthest from job market
- Local Reach/Localism VCS connected to and embedded in local communites Key aspect of Govt agenda
- "Large contracts Vs local Priorities"

- Trust led by and accountable back to service users and communities

Strengths/Offer of VCS



- Holistic approach work with individuals long term, with the focus on respect for person rather than solving a "problem"
- Additionality besides helping person towards work, will help them deal with other issues such as housing, health, offending etc
- Partnerships able to draw in tailored packages of support using other voluntary organisations and/or volunteers
- Links to other funds: European Social Fund (inc ESF Community Grants) a good example

Issues for VCS



- Scale of contracts
- Appropriate level of engagement
- Finance esp. cashflow
- Mission drift for organisations
- Exploitation poor contract terms



How do VCS groups enter the supply chain?

- Some organisations will be able to enter the supply chain in their own right
- Other (usually smaller) organisations might enter via partnerships and consortia



 To enable North West based Third Sector Learning, Skills and Employability providers to access, obtain and deliver large scale contracts that have

either

 not been previously available to them for reason of size and/or delivery requirements

or

 because the organisations holding the contracts are unable to offer a viable subcontract for delivery

- Identify suitable contracts for delivery by the SPV inc. sub-contracts in the WP
- Demonstrate sufficient combined strength of financial stability and management expertise to obtain large contracts
- Using economies of scale and a not dividend distributing business model ensure fair sub contracts and sustainable delivery agreements for partner organisations
- The SPV will positively co-ordinate, support and utilise smaller local delivery organisations, brokering partnerships where necessary



- Engage employers throughout the region to provide sustainable, local employment to participants
- Develop a common standard of quality for the SPV (already developed Quality Toolkit)
